By recognising and respecting each other's contributions within the care team, you will be providing a flexible and holistic approach to people who access the services we offer. Everyone is unique, and so are their needs – the team at Myton understands this concept very well. Patients are valued for the unique life they lead, as well as their role in the lives of those they love. Their life deserves dignity. People may forget what you say, but they never forget how you make them feel... This is how you can make a difference. Volunteering with the Spiritual & Pastoral Care Team will be a demanding and challenging opportunity, yet a very rewarding and fulfilling one that allows you to be part of supporting someone living and coping with a life limiting illness.





Key Duties – What your role will involve

Following completion of The Myton Hospices Spiritual & Pastoral Care mandatory training programme, your role will involve the following:

- To visit patients as appropriate, to practice active listening and to offer confidential pastoral, emotional and spiritual support to patients regardless of denomination, culture or ethnicity
- To refer on to the Chaplains as appropriate for specialist support
- There is the option to be involved in leading and / or supporting the range of services we offer e.g. monthly services of Holy Communion (weekdays), bi-monthly Remembrance Services (Sunday PM), and annual Light Up A Life services (Sunday evenings in Advent)
- To maintain accurate written and electronic records of patient encounters
- ☆ To work as part of a multi-disciplinary team, giving feedback to clinicians where appropriate
- Attendance at meetings of the Spiritual & Pastoral Care Team to keep up to date with developments within the team and with best professional practice
- Attendance at reflective practice sessions and personal supervision sessions
- Being aware of the range of spiritual care and support we offer across Myton and how service users can access this
- Adminishing confidentiality and working to Myton's policies and procedures are vital in this role.

An enhanced Disclosure & Barring check will be required for this volunteer role.

Skills & Qualities – Will the role suit me? Yes, if you have...

- Some understanding / experience of the practice of active listening and a willingness to develop it further
- A warm, friendly and empathetic demeanour
- The ability to relate to people of different ages, personalities and backgrounds
- The ability to put your own interests and agenda entirely to one side while interacting with patients, their families and visitors
- An awareness of your own spiritual and emotional biases and vulnerabilities
- An interest in, and knowledge of, the variety of ways in which people express spiritual awareness, beliefs and distress
- The ability to sustain a conversation on almost anything!
- An interest in the field of palliative and supportive care, or a willingness to learn more about the needs of people in this area
- An awareness of the physical problems and psychological issues that patients and families may experience or present with, and a commitment to developing your personal skills and knowledge in these areas
- The ability to work as part of a multi-disciplinary team (MDT)

- Commitment to your volunteer role and flexibility when it is needed
- The ability to keep accurate records, to respect confidentiality, and to be aware of personal boundaries (your own and other people's)
