The Volunteering Opportunity – How you can make a difference

To be part of a team that strives to maintain Hospice gardens to an excellent standard. The garden is enjoyed and used by our patients and their families for recreation and contemplation purposes, to help spiritual well being, and a place to sit and reflect whatever the season.

Key Duties – What your role will involve

1. Gardening Maintenance

Tasks may vary on a weekly or seasonal basis and could include:

- Soil cultivation, digging, forking, mulching, watering, raking, weeding, de-heading, edging, pruning, bed preparation, planting and pots maintenance
- Grass and hedge cutting by safe use of the petrol mower and strimmers or hedge cutters (grass cutting is not required at Rugby)
- To keep the tool shed clean and tidy and to ensure all gardening equipment is kept secure
- To keep the gardens and footpaths clear and free from litter at all times





To leave the garden tidy after working in it by gathering up any cuttings or prunings, and removing to the designated area for transport to the local authority recycling facility.

2. Garden Planning

- To maintain the garden within budgetary restrictions
- ☆ To assist with seasonal planning and future development of garden projects where appropriate.

3. Public Engagement

- Engage in conversation with patients, families or carers to encourage interest in the gardens and respond to any of their queries
- Engage with visiting corporate or community gardeners and facilitate a positive working relationship.

4. Health & Safety

- Ensure compliance with Myton wide and garden specific Health & Safety regulations and procedures
- Ensure the safety of all visitors to the garden e.g. be conscious of tool position and location at all times to avoid accidents
- Respond to accidents and incidents as they occur, referring as necessary to a manager or seeking appropriate assistance
- Report any garden hazards to a member of the Estates Team, or Day Hospice team at Rugby e.g. cracked paving, bees nests, rodent activity etc.
