At **The Myton Hospices**, we believe that everyone matters for every single moment of their life. We focus on enhancing life when cure is no longer an option. We are not just about end of life care, we support patients and their families right from the moment they are diagnosed.

We have three hospices in Coventry, Rugby and Warwick, and have the only Hospice Inpatient Beds in Coventry and Warwickshire. We care for people aged 18+ living with a wide range of life-limiting illnesses including Respiratory, Heart & Neurological conditions, Cancer and Organ failure.

We are a charity, we are not the NHS. Just 20% of our funding comes from the NHS, and we have to raise over £11 million every year to continue providing our services free of charge to patients and their loved ones. We rely on support from amazing people like you to ensure we can be there for more people when they need us most, now and in the future.

Simon's Myton Story

At 33 years old, in 2018, Simon was diagnosed with kidney cancer and after a year of treatment, including chemotherapy and radiotherapy, the Palliative Care Team mentioned Myton's services. Simon was admitted to Warwick Myton Hospice for symptom control in November 2019, but it was evident that Simon was too poorly to go back home.

The reason why I donate and fundraise is so other people can receive the same excellent care my family received after my husband was supported by Myton.

My children and I regularly talk about why we're taking on these challenges, and the conversation always comes back to how we wish everyone who needs it can access Myton's wonderful services.

It's your worst nightmare and you wish you never have to go to Myton.
But if you do, they can be there for you.

3 | Set up your JustGiving page



If you haven't already, now is the perfect time to set up your JustGiving page so you can start getting sponsored and collecting donations!


You may be wondering why we've asked you to set up a JustGiving page? By using JustGiving as the primary fundraising platform, it allows our team to work more efficiently, saving us time and money. Your money is transferred to us automatically at The Myton Hospices, safely and securely.





4 | Our top ten hints and tips for successful fundraising on JustGiving

Sometimes, we all need a little inspiration to get us going. Here is an example JustGiving page. You can see they have implemented a few of our tips and tricks.



1. INCLUDE A SUMMARY

Grab people's attention by adding your reasons for taking part in the event or tell your story about why you're fundraising in the summary section of your Just Giving page.

2. UPLOAD A PHOTO

Fundraisers with pictures on their page often raise 14% more for each picture they share along their fundraising journey. Don't forget to also upload your photos from the day itself as 20% of donations are made after the event has occurred.



3. MAKE SURE YOU SAY THANK YOU

Every time you get a donation make a public thank you on your social media tagging your donor if possible and including a link to your page. Donations can snow ball this way

4. SET A FUNDRAISING GOAL

Did you know that JustGiving pages with a target raise 46% more sponsorship than pages without one? Share your target so people can help you to reach your goal.

5. SHARE, SHARE, SHARE

Please don't be afraid to share your fundraising page with friends and family, people love to see what you're achieving. Did you know the top 5% of fundraisers on JustGiving share their page 15 times on average, so don't be shy! Don't forget to share via email as well, just in case your friends and family aren't on social media platforms.

6. CONNECT YOUR FITNESS APP

This is a great way for your supporters to see all of the hard work you are putting in.

8. INCLUDE YOUR OFFLINE TOTAL

Everyone loves to see how you're getting on with your overall fundraising. So please don't forget to add your offline donations to your total. Why not take a sponsorship form into your place of work?

9. TAKE THE TIME TO PERSONALISE YOUR JUSTGIVING PAGE

Let your passion show through with a compelling explanation of what has motivated you to fundraise for Myton.

10. RECORD YOURSELF

Making short video clips of your training or talking about your challenge is a great way to get donations coming in.





















5 | Fundraising ideas

Bake Sale: Who doesn't love a sweet treat? Host a bake sale in your community or workplace and let those goodies turn into donations!

Dress Down Day: Partner with local schools or businesses to have a dress down day where participants donate for the privilege to wear casual attire.

Match funding/workplace giving: Some companies offer support to their fundraising employees by offering a donation. These donations are sometimes matchable which means if, for example, you raise £500 they may match it and donate £500. This is a great way to boost your fundraising so make sure you ask your employer if they offer this benefit.

Quiz Night: Organise a quiz night at a local pub or virtually. Charge an entry fee and offer a prize for the winning team.

Tuck shop at your workplace: Fundraising in the workplace is a great way to get your colleagues involved. Why not run a little tuck shop in the office kitchen to keep your colleagues fuelled for their work day. Whether a sweet treat, like a nice cake, tickles their fancy, or they prefer something savoury, it's a great way to boost your fundraising all while keeping your office

happy. We can provide a collection tin to go next to your tuck shop.

Raffle: Organise a raffle at your local pub, community centre or workplace. Gather a few goodies and prizes and charge a couple of pounds for tickets!




Sweepstake: Use our bonus ball template to run a sweepstake. It's a fun and easy way to boost your fundraising total.

Static bike in a supermarket: Find out if you can set up a static bike in a high-traffic location, like a supermarket, and invite people to take a short ride in exchange for a donation. It's a great way to get some exercise and spread awareness of your fundraising.

Barry's Myton Story


After a two to eight week prognosis with a stage 4 inoperable mouth cancer diagnosis, Barry Buckley, was admitted to Coventry Myton Hospice.

7 | Keep it legal and safe

We are very grateful to you for fundraising in aid of The Myton Hospices. Your safety and wellbeing is our priority so please ensure you adhere to all laws and health and safety guidelines when organising and completing your activity.

Promoting your fundraising

You should make it clear throughout your fundraising that you are fundraising 'In aid of The Myton Hospices' and that you do not represent the charity. For example, '[Name of your fundraising activity] raising funds In aid of The Myton Hospices.' Please ensure that you have permission to use any images or logos.

Collecting funds

You need a licence from your local authority to collect funds on the street, in a public place or by going from house to house. It is illegal to collect funds in this way without a licence.

Raffles

Small raffles can be held as part of a larger event and is a great way to maximise the amount of money you can raise, you will just need to follow these guidelines:

- Tickets must only be sold during the event, on the premises where the event is taking place.
- The draw must take place during the event

- No more than £500 can be spent on buying prizes.
- No cash prizes can be given.
- All tickets must be sold at the same price and no discounts are allowed on bulk buys (for example, five for the price of four).
- Tickets should not be bought or sold by young people under 16.

There are strict and complex laws relating to raffle and lotteries, which do not fall into this category, and full guidelines on raffles and lotteries are available from your local authority or the Gaming Board.
