Terminal Care Patients referred for terminal care, with an estimated prognosis of weeks. These patients may not require specialist palliative care but have expressed their preferred place of death as Myton. Nurse-led beds Are to provide care for patients with a limited prognosis, but without complex symptoms that require medical input. The primary aim of the beds is to improve the quality of end-of-life care for patients who have complex nursing needs due to advanced progressive life-limiting illness, avoid inappropriate hospital admissions/inpatient stays and to facilitate patients with non-complex needs to choose the Hospice as their preferred place of death. The FAB programme aims to improve your confidence in managing your fatigue and breathlessness, enabling you to reduce your anxiety and regain some sense of control. A core element of the programme is to have the opportunity to talk through your circumstances with an Occupational Therapist and a Physiotherapist.
